

10 REASONS WHY TO VISIT & EXPERIENCE GRANADA




























1. THE ALHAMBRA, GENERALIFE AND ALBAICÍN, ALL DECLARED HUMAN HERITAGE SITES BY UNESCO.

Discover the **Alhambra**, **the jewel of Granada**, perched majestically on La Sabika hill between the Darro and Genil rivers. Once a royal palace, fortress, and military stronghold, this iconic monument combines centuries of Nasrid and Christian history with breathtaking gardens, forests, and vibrant biodiversity—truly a "Green Alhambra."

Just across the city lies the Albaicín, Granada's historic heart, with winding streets, whitewashed houses, and cypresses that transport you straight to its enchanting Muslim past.

Visiting Granada isn't just sightseeing—it's stepping into a living story of culture, beauty, and history.

SIERRA NEVADA NATURAL PARK

The diversity of the Granada province offers great climatic contrasts, caused by the numerous geographical features that form it, so different and yet so close at the same time.

The Sierra Nevada Natural Park and La Alpujarra boast a mountain climate, featuring mild summers, extremely cold winters, and abundant precipitation in the form of rain or snow.

TROPICAL COAST

On the other hand, the Granada coast is the only subtropical microclimate in Europe, as a result of gentle winds from North Africa and the cooling influence of the Sierra Nevada mountains. In winter, it records continental Europe's highest temperatures, with daily highs averaging 18°C and lows around 10°C.

In winter, it records continental Europe's highest temperatures, with daily highs averaging 18°C and lows around 10°C. During summer, temperatures soar to an average of 25°C. These unique conditions make Granada's tropical coast the only European region where subtropical fruits like cherimoya, avocado, mango, and papaya grow.





7. A teaching and research pioneer destination

Granada is a leading center for teaching and research, highlighted by the historic University of Granada, founded in 1531, along with hospitals, CSIC research centers, and the Health Sciences Technology Park. The university is renowned for excellence across science, humanities, and technology, attracting scholars worldwide and fostering a vibrant academic community.









8. Easy to get to the city.

Granada boasts excellent national and international connections. The city's airport is just 25 minutes from the center.

A <u>direct bus service</u> runs every 30 minutes, taking you through the city center and ending at the Congress Center. The fare is approximately €3, making it a convenient and affordable option for attendees.

While Málaga International Airport, one of Spain's busiest hubs, is just over an hour away and is conveniently connected to Granada by an hourly direct bus service.

Also, high-speed trains provide efficient links to major destinations such as Madrid and Barcelona, and within the city, frequent and affordable public transport options, including the subway and buses.
